This post will involve travelling across sites and working in pupils' own homes.

- To apply the principles of 'Quality First' and 'Adaptive' teaching in the classroom and ensure that pupils' social and emotional, as well as academic, needs are met
- To support the service's personal development priorities by fulfilling the role of a 'Lead Tutor'
- To take responsibility for putting in place interventions to ensure pupils make expected or better progress from initial baseline assessment and/or FFT predictions
- To ensure that appropriate resources and equipment are in place which are kept and maintained to expected standards
