### Reception

What another super week in Reception! The theme this week was all about our favourite hobbies! #### Vear 1

What a fabulous week of learning we have had again in Year 1! The children were super excited to become designers and enjoyed creating their own bowls and plates for our class teddies to eat their sandwiches from during Design & Technology week. We started by researching different bowls and plates, looking at the materials they are made from and the shapes, colours and patterns that are used. Then we used this knowledge to create our own unique designs by sketching and labelling our ideas. We then used our modelling skills to sculpt the clay into the shapes we wanted to achieve. Once our models were dry, we used paint to really bring our designs to life! To make them look professional, we used a mixture of PVA and water to give them a shiny glaze. We are very proud of ourselves and think our teddies would be too! Well done Year 1! Miss Swain and Miss Delargy.







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#### Year 2

It has been Design & Technology week in school this week. Year 2 have had a cookery focus, in particular, fruit salad! On Monday, they tasted and ranked different fruits. On Tuesday, they decided which fruits they wanted to include in their own fruit salad, discussed how to prepare it safely and also, made a bar chart of the class's favourite fruits. On Thursday, they learnt how to use a knife safely, cut their chosen fruit up, assembled their fruit salad, enjoyed eating it and finally evaluated the finished fruit salad. In our English lessons, the children have enjoyed the book "John Patrick Norman McHennessy, the boy who was always late". The children have drawn a story map of the main parts of the story and enjoyed 'freeze-framing' different scenes and 'hot-seating' the two main characters. In our maths lesson, we continued our learning about money. The children learnt to count up totals of pence, and pounds and have combined pence and pounds. What an exciting week! Well done Year 2. #### Year 3

It has been another wonderful week of learning in Year 3. In our English lessons, we identified the features of Instruction texts. Having practised how to use time adverbials, adverbs and imperative verbs, we wrote instructions detailing how to make our very own smoothies. As mathematicians, we have been learning about equivalent fractions and found out that even though some fractions look different, they can have the same value.

This week, we have thoroughly enjoyed getting creative in our D&T lessons. As designers, we were tasked with making an Ancient Greek pot using a mouldable material, which linked perfectly with our learning of Ancient Greeks in the Autumn term. We commenced the week by researching Ancient Greek pottery and its uses. Having sketched our own designs, we included measurements for our pots. Then came the exciting part of using clay! We used the 'score, slip and blend' technique to join two pieces of clay together and gave the pots handles. After allowing our pots to dry, we painted and decorated them with Greek patterns. 


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#### Year 4

Year 4 have been enjoying DT this week. They started the week investigating different types of bags, considering the material they were made from and how usable they were. We then went on to design our own tote bags, thinking carefully about the person the bag was being designed for and the purpose of the bag. The children have worked really hard sewing their bags using a running stitch. Threading the cotton through the eye of the needle was tricky, as was tying knots to stop the cotton from slipping through the material. However, everyone has displayed great perseverance. Once the children had made the main part of their bag, they then attached handles using buttons. This is an invaluable skill to use as they may find they need to sew buttons back onto clothing when they are older. This week, we also finished reading our class study book "Varjak Paw". The children really enjoyed this book, with some even saying "it was the best book they'd ever read". I'm so pleased the children enjoyed this story; it really is a great book. It does have a sequel, "The Outlaw, Varjak Paw", so keep a lookout in the library. This week was also our penultimate week at swimming. The swimming teachers at the Xcel Centre used this as an assessment week, all of the children have made such great progress. Well done everyone, try to keep using that skill! it's an important life skill and could save your life one day. ### Year 5

Year 5 have been very busy this week as it has been Design and Technology Week. Our question was 'How can we store make up for an Ancient Egyptian?' We found out that both Egyptian men and women wore make up, so we set about designing something for them to store it in. First, we looked at makeup cases and considered what materials they are made of, how they are fastened and what makes a good make up case. Then it was time to practise our sewing skills! Our first task was to sew on a button. This was trickier than it sounds! In addition, we practised running stitch and learnt how to do whip stitch and blanket stitch. It was important to learn how to finish off as well so that our sewing stayed strong. We were so proud of how the children persevered with their sewing, even if it didn't come easy to them, showing our school's value of discipline. We were equally proud of the children for showing teamwork by helping others and sharing their skills. Next, it was time to create a design for our makeup cases. As designers, we then had to make a paper pattern of our design, and a prototype using j cloths. At last, it was time to begin making our makeup cases with felt. The children employed all the sewing skills they had learnt over the course of the week. They should all be so proud of themselves!
