Job Purpose:

Based at Plas Dol y Moch in Snowdonia, Wales, to be a member of the Coventry Outdoors staff team delivering a range of Outdoor Education and Adventurous Activities, working with children, young people, schools, families and other key groups. Experienced in the provision of outdoor education our tutors will be able to deliver high-quality programmes and sessions to the wide variety of groups that visit our centre each year. Our tutors will also support with operational duties to ensure the safe and effective function of the Centre.

Main Duties and Responsibilities:

Under the direction and support of the management team, the Outdoor Education & Activity Tutor is responsible for:

- Leading groups of children and young people on a range of on and offsite outdoor adventure activities focused on each groups specific aims and learning objectives
- Preparing, delivering reviewing, and evaluating those aspects of delivery for which you are responsible at any one time e.g. canoeing, climbing, mountain activities, gorge activities, underground activities, field work, environmental activities; this in relation to the Centre's policies, curriculum documentation and development plan
- Facilitating onsite evening activities, and if programmed, to remain on-call overnight to respond to any emergencies at the Centre (note there is an additional payment for overnight duties).
- Assisting with the general running of the Centre
- Maintaining your relevant National Governing Body (NGB) qualification, remaining current in these qualifications, maintaining any Centre validations and appropriate first aid qualification relating to the activities programmed to deliver
- Working within the remit of your qualifications and/or validations as directed by the Head of Centre
- Driving the Centre vehicles, including towing trailers, within the Centres operating procedures
- Ensuring all technical equipment used is fit for purpose, isolate, and report any damaged equipment as soon as reasonably practicable to the Head of Centre
- Showing high levels of energy, enthusiasm and professionalism, acting as a suitable role model for the children and young people; focusing on engagement, participation, development and enjoyment, working both independently and alongside other staff.
- Working professionally within the team and on your own initiative, often without direct supervision.
- Being punctual, ensuring effective personal planning and preparation and to dress and act in a professional manner at all times in line with centre expectations.

- Continuously promoting and ensuring the welfare and safeguarding of children and young people in your care.
- Ensuring completion of any documentation required in relation to Outdoor Education Curriculum projects, programmes and sessions, such as assessment, evaluation and risk management.
- Seeking at all times to foster good relations, keeping others informed of relevant issues and developments regarding the service.
- Ensuring the relevant requirements of the Adventure Activities Licensing Authority are adhered to
- Ensure facilities and equipment used are safe for users prior to and during activities in accordance with City Council, departmental Health and Safety, NGB and Centre Operations.
- To support in the plans to develop areas of curriculum programming, activities and sessions
- To liaise with OES staff in Coventry for curriculum and course development & to travel to Coventry (rare & as required) to support with delivery and planning.
- Carrying out the duties of this post with due regard to relevant Council policies and in line with the Safety Policies and Operating Procedures of the Outdoor Education Service
- Any other duties and responsibilities within the range of the salary grade.

Physical Demands

The work requires moderate levels of physical effort. It involves lifting and handling of outdoor/activity equipment, play equipment and other resources and to be involved in practical activities and physical care of learners and the physical environment.

Activities are mainly outdoors and will require, at times, delivering in unpredictable weather conditions.

The post holder must comply with Coventry City Council's health and safety policy and in particular is required:

- To take reasonable care for their own health and safety at work and of those who may be affected by their actions or by their omissions
- To cooperate with their line manager and senior management, to work safely, to comply with health and safety instructions and information and undertake appropriate health and safety training as required
- Not to intentionally or recklessly interfere with or misuse anything provided in the interests of health, safety and welfare
- To report to their manager any health and safety concerns, hazardous condition or defect in the health and safety arrangements.
