Job Purpose:

- To lead the delivery of all operational systems which provide high-quality, effective and economically-viable outdoor learning sessions within Coventry either at a recognised venue or in school grounds, with line management responsibility for all staff employed to teach and/or assist the programmed sessions and budgetary responsibilities for this area of outdoor education.
- To ensure the post holder is up to date in the knowledge around statutory responsibilities for Trips and visits undertaken by schools and offer advice and guidance.
- Support the development and implement programmes of high-quality activities available yearround. Ensuring that the programme delivers an outstanding experience for all visitors in Coventry, ensure this area is able to provide a significant commercial return to the organisation

Main Duties and Responsibilities:

- To have an up to date working knowledge of all the Department for Education, statutory responsibilities for ensuring all trips and visits across Coventry meet national guidance levels and Health and Safety legislation.
- 2. To have lead responsibility for operations within Coventry City, overseeing all aspects of the day to day delivery of high-quality outdoor learning sessions by the staff team. Directly manage the staff team and any trainees, including the selection, appointment, induction, integration, deployment, training, and development of staff, through the effective application of the appraisal system.
- 3. Develop the team through individual and team development, development of roles, responsibilities and relationships so as to align service needs with individual skill-sets/competencies and oversee a culture of high quality provision including all aspects of safety (Adventure Activities Licensing Authority compliance, staff competencies and equipment use).
- 4. Develop a policy for activity and course provision in Coventry which is linked to the curriculum by advising and supporting the team in their work liaising with curriculum leaders-in schools developing outdoor learning sessions, the necessary resources and their links to the curriculum.

- 5. Manage the staffing and equipment budgets to ensure that all courses are appropriately resourced, with requirements being integrated in a strategic renewal/replacement cycle.
- 6. Lead an innovative approach to review and develop operational functions which support the delivery of a high-quality service in the City by incorporating user feedback and course evaluation data.
- 7. Work effectively with Outdoor Education Service Senior Leadership Team colleagues by contributing specialist skills and knowledge to meetings convened to enhance service delivery and ensure the budgets are balanced.
- 8. Liaise with officers, teachers and course leaders in Coventry, to co-ordinate the planning and organisation of courses including target setting and course objectives.
- 9. To be the first point of contact to resolve issues relating to operational matters in the city relating to Trips and Guidance and the delivery of courses.
- 10. Take a lead in promoting the business to partners, stakeholders and prospective customers, taking a lead role in relationships with strategically important customers at the centre.
- 11. Support and lead the continued commercial growth and development for the Outdoor Education Service programmes, seeking ways to support growth in delivery during peak periods, identify new markets, new activities.
- 12. Any other duties and responsibilities within the range of the salary grade.

The post holder must comply with Coventry City Council's health and safety policy and in particular is required:

- To take reasonable care for their own health and safety at work and of those who may be affected by their actions or by their omissions
- To cooperate with their line manager and senior management, to work safely, to comply with health and safety instructions and information and undertake appropriate health and safety training as required
