# Job Description

To provide strategic and operational leadership as a member of the SLT, ensuring the highest standards of behaviour, teaching, learning and pupil outcomes. The postholder will lead on behaviour and culture so that all pupils feel safe, valued and ready to learn, and will contribute to school improvement through phase leadership (KS1 or KS2) and the leadership of a core subject.

## Duties & Responsibilities

- Lead, develop and embed a whole-school approach to behaviour, attitudes and culture that reflects the school's ethos, motto and values.
- Ensure consistent implementation of the school's behaviour policy, including routines, expectations, rewards and sanctions.
- Use behaviour and attendance data to identify trends, evaluate impact and plan targeted interventions.
- Lead liaison with parents/carers regarding behaviour, ensuring strong partnership working and clear communication.
- Promote pupil voice and positive relationships, ensuring pupils understand expectations and feel supported.
- Provide strong leadership to the phase team to secure high standards of teaching, learning, behaviour and outcomes.
- Lead effective phase meetings focused on curriculum, pedagogy, assessment and consistent practice.
- Drive improvements in phase outcomes using data-informed actions and measurable targets.
- Ensure the curriculum is well-sequenced, knowledge-rich and meets statutory requirements.
- Monitor and evaluate teaching and learning within the subject, providing support and challenge to improve outcomes.
- Support staff to develop subject knowledge and effective pedagogy through coaching, training and modelling.
- Support the Headteacher in creating and communicating a clear vision for the school and translating this into sustained improvement.
- Lead by example in delivering high-quality teaching; model effective practice and support staff to improve through coaching and professional development.
- Ensure effective safeguarding, wellbeing and inclusion practices across the school.
- Work collaboratively with colleagues, governors and external partners to secure the best outcomes for pupils.
