

Coventry Youth Justice Service

Coventry Youth Justice Service is a fast-paced multi agency team consisting of staff from the Local Authority, Police, Probation, Health and Education.

We work with children and young people aged 10-18 who have offended, who are subject to court orders and out of court disposals or being diverted from the criminal justice system.

Our aim is to prevent offending behaviour by children and young people, and we do this by engaging with professional/community support networks, children/young people, and their families/carers to assess their needs and develop desistance and strength-based plans.

We work with children/young people, their families, and victims of youth crime in multiple settings including: the community, their homes, court and the secure estate to offer support, guidance and management to build pro social behaviours and positive support networks.

The Youth Justice Board (YJB) oversee the work of youth justice services.
