JOB DESCRIPTION

- Be able to demonstrate good organisational skills in keeping children's records and evaluating children's progress and achievements.
- Able to demonstrate an understanding of the coach's role and responsibilities in promoting and supporting positive behaviour within lessons and throughout the school.
- Be able to communicate effectively with adults and children.
- Prepare and present informative reports to parents.
- Have an understanding and commitment to promote equal opportunities in all aspect of school life.

- Be able to demonstrate evidence of excellent subject knowledge and expertise in Physical Education.
- Promote the welfare of children and to follow the child protection procedures adopted in the school's Safeguarding Policy.
- To attend, and when appropriate lead, professional development and planning meetings and contribute to the whole school's planning activities.
- To have a commitment to enhancing the school's sporting/healthy lifestyle profile through supporting: the creation of a number of school 'teams'; planning and delivering Partnership sporting festivals; running after school clubs; assemblies, displays, website etc.
- Be prepared to lead school teams outside the regular school day e.g. evenings & weekends. Additional payments would be made in such an event.
