Main Duties & Key Accountabilities

- To provide specialist delivery of Outdoor Education adventure activities to children and young people in line with the course aims
- To provide specialist delivery of Outdoor Education and adventurous activity to families and adults in line with the course aims
- To prepare, deliver, review and evaluate those aspects of delivery for which you are responsible at any one time e.g. canoeing, climbing, mountain activities, gorge activities, underground activities, field work, environmental activities; this in relation to the Centre's policies, curriculum documentation and development plan
- Where required, to provide written contributions for assessments and reports
- To promote inclusion and equality of opportunity within all sessions and programmes
- Remain current and competent in all appropriate National Governing Body (NGB) qualification, Centre validations and appropriate first aid qualification relating to the activities programmed to deliver ensure, and ensure you work within the remit of your qualifications and/or validations as directed by the Head of Centre
- To safeguard the welfare of all students, ensuring sessions, programmes and activities are undertaken in accordance with NGB standards and the Centre's policies and procedures.
- Drive the Centre vehicles, including towing trailers, within the Centres operating procedures
- Ensure all technical equipment used is fit for purpose, isolate, and report any damaged equipment as soon as reasonably practicable to the Head of Centre
