



Job Purpose:

To carry out teaching and other professional duties.

Main Duties and Responsibilities:

- Plan and prepare lessons for a class or a group of pupils allocated to him/her.
- Teach, according to their educational needs, the pupils assigned to him/her, including the setting, and marking of work to be carried out by the pupil in school and elsewhere.
- Assess, record and report on the development, progress and attainment of pupils and make records of and reports on the personal and social needs of the pupils.
- Promote the general progress and well-being of individual pupils and of any class or group of pupils assigned to him/her.
- Communicate and consult with the parents of pupils.
- Participate in the relevant appraisal arrangements of the school.
- Review from time to time his/her methods of teaching and programmes of work.
- Attend and fully participate in weekly staff, planning and phase meetings.
- Participate in arrangements for his/her further training and professional development as a teacher.
- Advise and co-operate with the headteacher and other teachers on the preparation and development of courses of study, teaching programmes, methods of teaching and assessment and pastoral arrangements.
- Maintain good order and discipline among pupils and safeguard their health and safety when they are authorised to be on the premises and when they are engaged in authorised school activities elsewhere.
- Undertake any other reasonable duties as detailed by the headteacher.
- Lead a curriculum area.
- Carry out time limited key tasks as agreed in the annual Performance Management cycle.
- Any other duties and responsibilities within the range of the salary grade.

All duties and responsibilities must be carried out with due regard to the City Council's Health and Safety Policy.

Post holders will be accountable for carrying out all duties and responsibilities with due regard to the City Council's Equal Opportunities Policy.

Duties which include processing of any personal data must be undertaken within the corporate data protection guidelines.
