### Job Purpose:

The post holder will provide specialist substance misuse expertise to the multi-disciplinary assessment of parents referred to the service whilst their children are subject to Court proceedings. The post holder as senior substance misuse worker will provide a supervisory role to the FDAC substance misuse worker.

### Main Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. To provide specialised clinical assessments of parents/carer's where substance misuse has resulted in their children being subject to court proceedings. Upholding the FDAC model and working to the national standards of practice.
- 2. To contribute to the initial FDAC assessment of the parent, write non lawyer review reports and Final FDAC assessment reports reflecting the parental strengths and difficulties and whether these can be overcome in the timeframe for their child
- 3. To formulate for the formal planning of the intervention plan for the FDAC Trial for change with specific specialist advice to enable the parent /carer to achieve abstinence, taking into account the multiple theoretical perspectives and employing methods based upon evidence to manage presenting risk to the individual's health and wellbeing as well as behaviours as a result of their substance misuse difficulties.
- 4. To be responsible for the implementation of a range of interventions for parents/carer's in addressing the substance misuse. Assessing the immediate risk and management relevant to the individual parent/carer and providing specific substance misuse related and general health advice.
- 5. To develop effective relationships with the Parent, communicating with them in a highly skilled and sensitive manner. to impart information concerning the assessment, formulation and treatment of the parent as well as the sharing of difficult information.



- 6. To be responsible for the implementation of a range of interventions for parents/carer's adjusting and refining formulations with the FDAC team drawing upon different explanatory models and applying thinking forensically to problem solve.
- 7. To attend the FDAC court and contribute to the operation of the FDAC service from the Court on a weekly basis. Compiling assessments and reports for the court in accordance with the procedures and fidelity of the model.
- 8. To facilitate drug and alcohol testing of clients within the FDAC process ensuring timely collection and liaising with both the toxicology and the commissioned treatment agency.
- 9. The post holder should work flexibly outside of the office hours including some evenings and weekends to meet the needs of the service.
- 10. Maintain performance and development practice and experience in line with personal targets as agreed through supervision.
- 11. Any other duties and responsibilities within the range of the salary grade

The post holder must comply with Coventry City Council's health and safety policy and in particular is required:-

- To take reasonable care for their own health and safety at work and of those who may be affected by their actions or by their omissions
- To cooperate with their line manager and senior management, to work safely, to comply with health and safety instructions and information and undertake appropriate health and safety training as required
- Not to intentionally or recklessly interfere with or misuse anything provided in the interests of health, safety and welfare
- To report to their manager any health and safety concerns, hazardous condition or defect in the health and safety arrangements.
