1. QUALIFICATIONS / TRAINING

Qualified teacher status.

Evidence of involvement in INSET activities as a participant and a commitment to further professional development.

2. KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING

Knowledge and understanding of the principles and practice of primary education at Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 or Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2.

Up to date knowledge of the curriculum including the statutory requirements of the National Curriculum and/or EYFS if an Early Years practitioner.

Knowledge of a schools and teachers role in providing effectively for the needs of all pupils, including those with behavioural and/or learning special educational needs.

An understanding of the importance of cross curricula planning and delivery of PSHE and Equal Opportunities.

An understanding of the use of assessment data to set targets for improvement, to track individuals and groups and to use that knowledge as a means of successful intervention.
