To work collaboratively with partners and stakeholders to develop the "hub and spoke offer", building on existing partnerships and developing service delivery arrangements as part of the Family Hub Offer (in the building, through the community and through the digital offer).

To deliver a whole family approach to assessment, planning and intervention

Specific job purposes are:

- 1. To work in partnership with a range of services such as Family Health and Lifestyle Service, Schools, Early Years providers, Housing, Police, and third sector organisations to empower families to sustain positive changes that will improve the outcomes for children and young people as part of the Family Hub offer.
- 2. To reach out to meet and engage with children, young people and their families to help them receive the right help at the right time appropriate intervention, working collaboratively with partners and connect families to the Supporting Families Programme as appropriate
- 3. To provide responsive intervention to children, young people and their families in a timely way that best meets need to ensure families receive the right help at the right time
- 4. To lead on and be responsible for the planning and delivery of evidence based individual and group work programmes to children, young people and their families in collaboration with a range of settings

- To provide direct support to children, young people, and their families with a range of needs by building strong relationships to maximize sustained change for families and improve outcomes for children
- To lead on the establishment of the Family Hub Here to Help function into community settings, that enables families to receive responsive support and intervention
- To identify and navigate families to appropriate services and agencies that best meet their needs.

- To work with key partners to deliver a robust early help offer to children, young people and families providing direct intervention as part of a plan
- To provide direct support and intervention to children and families using a variety of evidence-based tools that demonstrate impact, delivered in a range of settings including the home as part of the Family Hub offer within local communities.
- To monitor and evaluate the impact of support and intervention delivered to children, young people, and families.
- Work with professionals to support children, young people, and their families with complex needs, contributing to assessments and undertaking direct work with children and families.
