Job Purpose: To support newly arrived and current cohort of Romanian / Roma

students, ensuring that they make excellent progress, have excellent attendance and that there is strong family collaboration with the

academy

 To act as an interpreter when necessary for individual meetings with parents/families of Romanian / Roma students

- To support the induction of new students into the academy, liaising with year leads as necessary
- Monitor the attendance and punctuality of the students, proactively intervening where needed
- To liaise with families of students regarding issues of attendance, punctuality and behaviour, in conjunction with year leads, EWO and child protection team
- To carry out home visits as appropriate to families of students
- To promote the importance of, and attendance at, whole academy parents evenings, progress days, and any other whole academy events with families.
- To provide standard translation of academy material into Romanian as and when required.
- Liaise with feeder primary schools as appropriate
- To support the Assistant Principal in carrying out other reasonable duties that aim to promote the progress and well being of Romanian / Roma students
- To mentor students and track their progress on our provision map software

- To represent Sidney Stringer Academy on any relevant community Romanian / Roma groups
- To support families with free school meal applications and similar initiatives that they may struggle to access without support
- Provide enrichment opportunities for students and ensure Romanian / Roma students are represented at academy enrichment events
- To investigate and share good practice from other schools regarding the integration of Romanian / Roma students
- To provide academic support for both Romanian / Roma and students with special educational needs in and out of lessons, differentiating resources as required to support learning
- To provide mainstream lesson support for Romanian / Roma and other students as required.
- To develop an understanding of the special educational needs of students you may be supporting within the classroom
- To take into account the student/s' special needs and ensure their access to the lesson and its content through appropriate clarification, explanations, equipment and materials
- To build and maintain successful relationships with students, treat them consistently, with respect and consideration.
- To help promote independent learning
- To help reinforce student learning through given strategies and techniques
- To help students record work in an appropriate way
- To develop study and organisational skills
- To help keep the students on task and to build motivation
- To model good practice to both students and staff as an educational professional, demonstrating excellent punctuality, attendance and integrity

Safeguarding

Teachers are accountable for the way in which they exercise authority, manage risk, use resources and protect students from discrimination and avoidable harm.
